When Peter de Wit reached the age of fourteen, he decided he wanted to become a cartoonist and started out by making a strip comic together with a friend. His work was published in magazines Eppo, Sjosji and in the Belgium newspaper Het Laatste Nieuws. De Wit created the comic 'Stampede', and for the magazine Eppo, he drew a comic about a dysfunctional family called 'De Familie Fortuin'. With Hanco Kolk, he produced Bryant the Brigand (Gilles de Geus). Along with Kolk, de Wit presented a course in comic-strip drawing for the educational

tv-channel Teleac.

His most famous strip, Sigmund is a daily comic about a psychiatrist who deals rather harshly with his patients and comments on the many things that occupy the minds of modern men and women today. New Age, stress, plastic surgery, advertising, drugs as well as the old topics: sex, violence, death, sports and the everlasting battle between the sexes. Sigmund has been published in the Dutch newspaper De Volkskrant since 1994 and is also published in newspapers in Belgium and Finland. In 1999, de Wit won the Stripschapprijs, the most prestigious Dutch comic award. Already fourteen succesful Sigmund volumes have been published. Number fifteen will be published in November 2006.

Peter de Wit's latest creation, once again produced in collaboration with Hanco. Hanco Kolk, is the daily newspaper comic strip *S1NGLE*, which is also published by De Harmonie.
